KCI AIRPORT

Since the first flight departed in February 2023, the new airport has seen a 17.7% increase in flights through 2023.

THE IMPACT:

- We like to imagine the airport as the friendly, inviting smile welcoming you to Kansas City. For Kansas City to recruit top talent to support the 'Top 8 Projects' highlighted in this report, many professionals will fly through KCI from outside the region. They'll experience a state-of-the-art airport that tells the story of our city through arts, businesses, and culture.
- More than 240 Kansas City-area firms contributed to the project, which generated over 6,500 design and construction related jobs.



Through the team's intentional procurement strategy, 133 minority-and women-owned Kansas City-based firms were awarded contracts on the project totaling more than \$320 million.




THE IMPACT:

- There was only 1 reported security incident for the 3-day weekend; the success of security and logistics bodes well for the next major sporting event, the 2026 World Cup.
- The event created 1,200 temporary jobs; indirect impact was seen as local hotels and restaurants hired more staff to accommodate increased foot traffic.
- More than 68,000 pounds of left over beverages, meals, and packaged snacks were donated to Harvesters and Pete's Garden. Dozens of non-profits received thousands of dollars in other donated materials following the event.

META at GOLDEN PLAINS

Meta will invest over \$800 million developing their 1 million square-foot data center at Golden Plains Tech Park. They now own **all the land** designated for the **800 acre** project; the development's first building was completed in Fall 2023.

THE IMPACT:

- Meta's selection puts a major spotlight on Kansas City's thriving technology industry. We believe Meta will be the first of many high caliber tech companies to land in KC; in 2019, Google officials reported a land acquisition in the Northland for a potential data center.
- The full development is expected to take about 10 years, involving thousands of construction jobs. The project is expected to generate about 360 full-time jobs with average annual wages of \$85,000.
- With each data center requiring skilled IT positions to operate the facilities, the project is expected to be a technology-driven stimulus for the region's economy.
 Other regional businesses are expected to reap the benefits with growth to support the data center.

CURRENT STADIUM

On March 16, 2024 the Kansas City Current will christen the \$117 million, 11,500-seat CPKC Stadium — the first in the world purpose-built for a women's professional sports team.





THE IMPACT:

- By owning the venue, Current will control revenue streams, including a 10-year naming-rights deal with CPKC rail network and several sponsors, controlled food and beverage revenue, and a rentable facility for outside events. It's estimated the Current's financial health will improve by at least \$20 million compared to the 2023 season.
- The stadium has spurred transformational development along the Riverfront including an 8,000 square foot beer garden and \$30 million boutique hotel, both opening March 2024. Future investment includes a retail plaza, office park, multifamily and the northbound Streetcar extension.
- The stadium is strategically designed to match Kansas City's need for mid-sized outdoor venues for entertainment and athletics. The stadium has generated interest from the NCAA, high school athletic associations, and FIFA. The project has been viewed as a key component in winning the 2026 World Cup bid.

Q: What sets the Kansas City business community apart?

Location: The centralized location and accessibility of transportation modes is extraordinary. The explosion of e-commerce makes KC the perfect location for distribution centers as you can move product anywhere in the continental US within 48 hours. The combined Canadian Pacific Kansas City Limited railroad places KC at the literal center of North American commerce; and the new airport means people will continue to be more connected to cities throughout the country.

Q: What changes have you seen in the Kansas City business landscape throughout your career?

Confidence in our product is the number one change I've seen in the 16 years I've lived and worked in Kansas City. Back in the 2000s, you knew KC was on the precipice of something big with the revitalization of downtown, but there was a pervasive sense of inferiority.

Lamenting the fact that KC wasn't Denver, Chicago or Austin was common. Today you can't leave the house without seeing someone wearing a Charlie Hustle "KC Heart" t-shirt... A recognition that Kansas City is unique and wonderful, and deserving of the attention.

We don't need to be Denver or Austin, we're Kansas City and that's pretty great.

Q: Tell us a little [more] about Shamrock's expansive office development and the growth the company is seeing in Kansas City?

We're currently in the second phase of our Overland Park East Campus development with construction progressing on a new 12-story tower adjacent to the **8-story building** our employees occupied in 2021. We're planning to move employees into the newest building late Summer 2024.

What started over 35 years ago as a freight brokerage serving agricultural and commodity shippers now includes products and services in supply chain logistics, finance, fuel savings, technology and more. Our customer base continues to grow daily; to accommodate this we now have 10 office locations throughout the U.S. with future expansion plans.

Q: What sets the Kansas City business community apart?

Working with large companies dedicated to giving back to the community: Panasonic, Meta, Google, (and of course, Shamrock) are driving huge growth in the surrounding communities, including Overland Park.

I was born and raised in Overland Park and have chosen to raise my own family here. It's neat to see the growth in the area and how much has changed over the past 10, 20 and even 30 years. I have fond memories of the old Standard Station car wash on the corner of 93rd & Metcalf and visits to the Children's Palace that was on the property for many years. It's been incredibly rewarding to be a part of this development on a professional and personal level.

UMKC

KC STREETCAR Expansion

The \$330 million Main Street Streetcar Expansion will extend the streetcar 3.5 miles south adding 15 stops to connect River Market to UMKC.

THE IMPACT:

A connected and accessible city will stimulate the economy of the Metro's urban core, attracting new residents, visitors, businesses, and opportunities for real estate development. All resulting in additional dollars being spent in Kansas City, and rising property values in the areas served by the Street Car.

- Use of public transportation creates a greener city, reducing traffic congestion and the associated carbon emissions. The Streetcar offers a much-needed transportation alternative for Kansas Citians.

Creating easy, reliable, and affordable transitions between businesses and other gathering spaces will help to create stronger bonds between neighborhoods.

PANASONIC BATTERY PLANT

86% of the 1st wing's exterior is complete

The largest economic development project in Kansas history -- a \$4 billion, 4.7 million square **foot** lithium-ion battery manufacturing plant to begin production March 2025.

THE IMPACT:

- Jobs. Jobs. It's expected the plant will produce 7,800 total jobs:
 - 51% direct jobs, 26% indirect jobs for suppliers and vendors, 23% induced jobs as area retailers/ service providers grow from the influx of jobs.
 - 20% of those are considered 'white collar'; 80% are production based.

\$2.5 BILLION est. annual economic impact for Kansas

- The batteries manufactured in the facility will reduce US dependence on China, helping make the state a key player in the domestic vehicle (EV) industry.
- Lifting up the workforce: Panasonic is working with area schools like Johnson County Community College and Kansas City Community College to build associate degree programs to continue a strong workforce pipeline.

2026 FIFA WORLD CUP

Kansas City will host 6 matches starting June 2026: 4 group-stage matches, 1 knockout round, and 1 quarterfinal.

KC is 1 of 16 sites in North America for the 2026 FIFA World Cup.

THE IMPACT:

- As a regional sports hub with an affordable cost of living, international attention from hosting the world's largest soccer event could help make Kansas City the next population hot spot.
 - Comparably, Atlanta has seen an increase in over 3 million residents since hosting the 1996 Olympics.
- Kansas City has earned recognition as the Soccer Capital of America with more than \$600 million in soccer facility investment in the last 15 years, including the Current stadium opening in 2024.
- Kansas City has gone all-in on this once in a lifetime event with the formation of KC2026, a non-profit organization overseeing strategy and delivery of host city duties. Its Board of Directors are made up of business executives, civic leaders, and elected officials.

Arrowhead's capacity is ~76,000; \$695 KC is expecting an additional MILLION 25,000 fans visiting without tickets to just 'take in' the event.

ROYALS BALLPARK DISTRICT

The potential \$2 billion investment is the largest public-private development project in Kansas City's history.

The ballpark could create \$135 million more in annual regional economic **output** in its first year than seen at The K today.

THE IMPACT:

- Announced February 2024, the Royals have their eyes set on east Crossroads for the planned ballpark district. Plans include team offices, hotel, residential, entertainment, and a bridge connecting the stadium to the planned South Loop Park project.
- Kansas City is lacking a sports entertainment district like many competing metros including St. Louis, Denver, and Minneapolis. With a mixed-use design, the district would be programmable year-round.
- The district has potential to become an urban centerpiece attracting visitors, employers, talent, and spending to the region.
- Construction of this new ballpark district could create 20,000 jobs, \$1.4 billion in labor income, and an estimated \$2.8 billion in total economic output, with additional adjacent investment.

- Multi-phase, decade long plan includes 40+ properties; historic buildings will be renovated in addition to new development
